## TOURNAMENT RULES

### 1. GOVERNING RULES

The tournament shall be governed in accordance with the rules of Hockey Canada, BC Hockey, Vancouver Island Amateur Hockey Association ("VIAHA") and the Peninsula Minor Hockey Association as herein established for this tournament.

### 2. ADMINISTRATION

- a. All teams must be in good standing with their respective Associations and governing bodies.
- b. It is the responsibility of each team to apply for and receive a tournament permission number and/or letter of permission to enter the tournament from their Association and/or governing body.
- c. No additional players, coaches or team official can be added to the roster once the team list has been submitted prior to the first game. All team officials must also be listed on the official roster that is submitted.
- d. Home teams will wear their light colored jerseys with the Away teams wearing their dark coloured jerseys. In the case of colours being close in colour, it will be the responsibility of the home team to change colours prior to the game starting.
- e. Team officials are responsible for verifying the game sheet at least 30 minutes prior to game time. Game sheets will be prepared in advance and will be available at the volunteer table.
- f. Keys for the dressing rooms can be obtained from the volunteer table. You will need to leave your car keys or ID to obtain your dressing room key. Your keys or ID will be returned after the game and it is verified that your dressing room is clean.
- g. There will be a minimum \$200.00 fine for any damage done to the dressing rooms or arena facilities. The team's home association will be responsible for any cost of remediation over and above the \$200 fine. Please lock your room when not in use.

### 3. GAME TIMES

Day 1 (Group Round Robin) : Jan 4, 2024 - All games slots will be 90 minutes in length ( not including the ice clean) and will consist of a 3 min warm-up, 1st period 15 min, 2nd period 20 min and 3rd period 20 min. All games on day 1 will stop exactly 4 minutes before the end of the scheduled time as per the arena wall clock regardless of how much time is on the game clock. All periods are stop time, there is no mid game ice clean. If teams are tied at the conclusion of the game, they remain a tie. There is no overtime during round robin play.

Day 2 (Golden Ticket Games and Quarter Finals): Jan 5, 2024 - All games slots will be 110 minutes in length (not including the ice clean) and will consist of a 3 min warm-up, 1st period 15 min, 2nd period 20 min and 3rd period 20 min. All games on Jan 5th will stop exactly 15 minutes prior to the end of the scheduled time as per the arena wall clock regardless of any time left on the game clock. If teams are tied at end of play refer to the overtime rules. All periods are stop time. There is no ice clean mid game.

Day 3 (Consolation games, Semi-Finals and Finals): Jan 6, 2024 - Semi Finals and Finals game slots will be 120 minutes in length (not including the ice clean) and will consist of a 5 min warm-up, 1st period 15min, 2nd period 20 min, 3rd period 20 min. Semifinal and Final games will end exactly 15 min before the end of the ice slot. If teams are tied at the end of play refer to overtime rules. Consolation game slot will be 110 minutes in length, and will consist of a 5-minute warm-up, 1st period 15min, 2nd period 20 min, 3rd period 20 min. Consolation games will stop exactly 4 minutes before the end of the scheduled time as per the arena wall clock regardless of how much time is on the game clock. All games on Day 3 will have a mid-game ice clean, first whistle after the 10-minute mark in the second period.



## TOURNAMENT RULES

#### 4. TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- a. The tournament consists of 2 divisions: The BENN division and the IRWIN division. The 2 divisions are separate brackets and are independent of each other. In each division there is 2 groups of 3 teams (Group A and Group B). There will be round robin play with in each group. All round robin games will be held on Day 1 January 4th, 2024.
- b. Round robin play Day 1, teams will be awarded 2 pts for a win, 1 pt for a tie and 0 pts for a loss. Goal differential will also be recorded with no team able to record a +/- rating of greater than 6 goals per game. Team standings after round robin play will be based on total points earned. If two or more teams have equal number of points, the position in the standings will be determined as follows:
  - Team with the most wins
  - Head-to-head results
  - Best overall goal differential rating (cumulative +/- rating after the 2 round robin games)
  - Team with lowest goals against
  - Team with the least penalty minutes
  - Flip of the coin
- c. No time outs in any games
- d. Following round robin play, the top teams in group A and B will advance to the Golden Ticket game and a bye to the semifinals.
- e. Golden Ticket Game: The winners of the Golden ticket game earn the choice of which semi-final game to play in. The Golden ticket holder must inform the tournament organizer which semi-final spot they want by 8:45pm on Jan 5th. The losing teams of the Golden ticket game will play the semi-final slot that was not selected.
- f. The 2nd and 3rd place teams in each group will cross over and play in the quarter finals. 2nd in Group A will play 3rd in Group B. 2nd in Group B will play 3rd in Group A. The winners of the quarter final games will advance to the semi-final games. The losing teams will play in the consolation games.
- g. MVP - There will be a game MVP selected from each team. The coaches will select their own MVP.

- h. Silver and Gold Medals will be presented on ice immediately following the Finals.
- i. Overtime and Shootout Format (All games on Day 2 and 3 with the exception of the Consolation games)

#### Overtime

In the event of a tie at the end of regular time, there will be a 7 minute (run time) sudden victory overtime period. Each team will play 3 skaters and a goaltender. Penalties called during overtime will result 2:00 min and 4 on 3 play or 5 on 3 play. On ice officials will be encouraged to rush face offs, once a team lines up, there will be a standing 5 count and if the other team has not lined up the puck will be dropped. Penalties from regulation will carry over to overtime. If there is no score during the overtime period the game will go to a shootout.

#### Shootout

##### First Round – 3 Shooters

Coaches will designate 3 shooters from each team. Home team will have the choice to shoot first or second. Teams will alternate shooters until all 3 of their players have shot. The winner will be determined by which team scores the most goals. Please note – when it becomes impossible for a team to win (i.e. one team scores on their first two attempts, and the other team scores no goals on their first two attempts) then the remaining “shooters” will not be required to shoot. If after all 6 shooters have shot, and the score is still tied – we then move onto the “Second Round – Sudden Death”.

##### Second Round - Sudden Death

Coaches will choose one shooter at a time (must not have shot before). Shootout will be Sudden Death. If Team A's shooter scores and Team B's shooter does not, then Team A wins (and vice versa). If both Team's shooters both miss or both score, both teams will select another new shooter and repeat the process until a winner is determined. Once all players on a team have been selected as shooters, the coach may then choose any player from his roster to shoot again.

# TOURNAMENT RULES

### 5. GENERAL INFORMATION

- a. The referee may, at their discretion, stop play in case of an injury, regardless of which team have possession of the puck.
- b. Penalties
  - i. If a team official receives a game misconduct, the tournament committee will review the incident and has the discretion to suspend that team official for the remainder of the tournament.
  - ii. Any player or team official who is assessed a Match Penalty or Gross Misconduct penalties will be suspended for the rest of the tournament and is subject to local, district or branch suspension as applied by the appropriate board.
  - iii. All major penalties will be reported to the Tournament Director following the game and subject to all suspensions outlined by Hockey Canada, BC Hockey and the VIAHA
- c. Commencing Play - Each team will be ready to commence play at the beginning of the allotted ice time.
  - i. Failure to field the minimum number of players or refusal to play will result in a loss being posted against the offending team. The on ice officials will give the offending team a 2 minute warning during the 5 minute warm up. If the team fails to start play they will be automatically assessed a 6-0 loss.
  - ii. Players and team officials will remain on the players' bench until the on-ice officials are present and allow the teams on the ice. 2 minute minor penalties will be assessed to all players who take to the ice surface prior to the officials.
- d. Protests and Appeals
  - i. The decisions of the on ice officials is final, there are no appeals of on ice decisions regarding playing rules.
  - ii. The tournament chair or their appointee will hear all other protests and appeals. All protests/appeals will be accompanied by a \$100.00 appeal fee. In the event of the protest/appeal being upheld the fee will be refunded. If the protest/appeal is declined the fee is forfeited. All protests/appeals will be ruled on prior to play of the next game for either of the teams playing in the game under protest/appeal.
- e. Fair Play
  - i. Team officials are responsible for insuring that their players conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner at all times during the tournament. Excessive misbehaviour by players may result in suspension from the tournament.
  - ii. At the sole discretion of the tournament director, any action by a player, team official or spectator which is dangerous, disruptive, or contrary to fair play may be dealt with by expulsion from further play or banned from the arena facilities.
  - iii. Abuse of game officials on or off the ice will not be tolerated. Any cases of harassment or abuse directed at an official will result in a review and may result in suspension at the tournament director's discretion.
